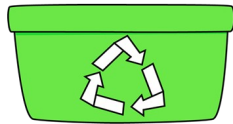
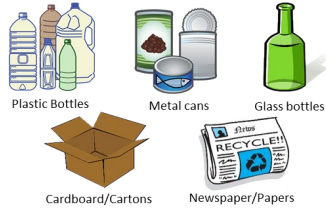

Put Recyclables in the Recycling Bin



Recycling Education – HOW to Recycle

Empty. Remove any remaining food or liquid contents from your recyclable item before placing it in a recycling container.

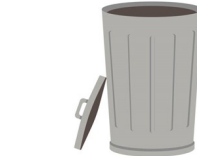
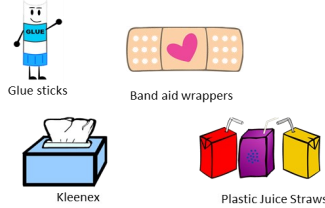
Clean. Lightly rinse the recyclable item to remove any remaining residue.

Dry. Gently shake out excess water or let the recyclable item air dry before placing it in a recycling container.

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

Wonderful Worms: Grades K-6

In this program, Miss Allison introduces students to Nature's recyclers: red wiggler worms. Students can watch worms move, tunnel and create useful compost for backyards and gardens.

Dunes in My Backyard: Grades 1-5

Many interesting and wild creatures live in Porter County. In this program students learn about creature habitats, ecosystems and diets.

Water Watchers: Grades 2-5

Water hydrates life. In this program students deep dive into new learning on the importance of water in nature.
